Title: Acupuncture for Chronic Low Back Pain (CAG-00452N)

Decision: The Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) will expand Medicare coverage to cover acupuncture for patients with chronic low back pain. Up to 12 visits in 90 days are covered under the following circumstances:

- For the purpose of this decision, chronic low back pain (cLBP) is defined as:
 - Lasting 12 weeks or longer;
 - nonspecific, in that it has no identifiable systemic cause (i.e., not associated with metastatic, inflammatory, infectious, etc. disease);
 - o not associated with surgery; and
 - not associated with pregnancy.
- An additional eight sessions will be covered for those patients demonstrating an improvement. No more than 20 acupuncture treatments may be administered annually.
- Treatment must be discontinued if the patient is not improving or is regressing.
- Acupuncture services must be provided by a medical professional eligible to furnish acupuncture under the Medicare program.

All types of acupuncture for any condition other than cLBP continue to be non-covered by Medicare.

What this means: Acupuncture for chronic low back pain may be covered up to 20 visits per year, for a member whose condition meets the Medicare criteria for coverage, as long as the member's pain improves with acupuncture. Services must be provided by a medical professional eligible to furnish acupuncture under the Medicare program. Please refer to the final decision memo for all coverage criteria.
